The next step is to attend the live meeting with XXXXX, on employment search preparation. If you cannot attend the live meeting, a link will be provided for you to review the presentation.

Next, hop over to the Week 6 materials to see which position you would like to pursue. Look at the tab: **Choice of Positions for Employment Interview**. Within this tabbed display are three different job descriptions. Choose the position that interests you, and that will be the one you will focus on for this week, and for your faculty interview in week 6.

Part 1: Cover Letter

Choose an actual employment opportunity for a nursing educator, and create a cover letter. Post the link for the job at the bottom of the cover letter. The letter (limited to one-page) should explain, within 3 paragraphs, why you are seeking the position, highlight several skills that prepare you for the position, and provide how you can be contacted for further information.

Part 2: CV

You should all have a resume, but now you will need a Curriculum Vitae (CV). After attending the workshop for CV building, create your own. You have registered in Optimal Resume, a service in Delhi that assists in resume creation. Design your CV according to the categories you learned in the workshop.

Part 3: Letter of Recommendation

Choose from one of the following, and create a letter of reference (limited to one-page, 350-500 words, that includes pertinent facts about the applicant, and why you feel this person would fit the position/program they are applying for:

- You are teaching in a BSN program and one of your students asks you to provide
 a Letter of Reference as part of their application to graduate school. Introduce
 your student and provide a convincing explanation of why this student should be
 accepted into the program.
- 2. A colleague asks you to provide a Letter of Reference for a faculty position in a generic BSN program. Your colleague has 2 years of experience in an ADN program, and one year of online teaching experience in a BSN program.
- 3. One of your peers is interested in leaving her position in staff development in the hospital for a role as an academic nurse educator. Create a convincing LOR that explains why this applicant is suited for the position.
- 4. You are asked to recommend your former nursing manager for a position as Director of Patient Care Services. Create a LOR that expounds upon her leadership abilities, potential, and why she would be an appropriate candidate for this position.

Nurse Educator/Administrator Employment Preparation: Live Interview

This is the second part of our unit to help develop skills to prepare for employment as an academic educator or nursing administrator. Throughout your career, as you progress from one level and role to the next, you will be interviewing for positions. The higher the level of the position, the more preparation is indicated and expected. This week will provide you with an opportunity to both practice and to reflect on the skills you need for future employment searches.

You have signed up for an interview slot in week 3. The Zoom link for your interview is: (link provided by faculty)

Refer to the tabbed display of <u>Choices of Positions</u> for Faculty/ Administrator Interview in this week's materials. Choose the one you used for your Assignment 2 cover letter, and that will be the position for which you will interview in this week's live meeting. The scope of the position is contained within these job descriptions. These are actual descriptions used for advanced nursing positions.

There are two parts to this assignment:

- 1. Live Interview: this week you will meet with School of Nursing faculty to simulate an actual employment interview. The interview will last for 25-30 minutes, and we will ask a list of prepared questions that are similar to what you can expect at an actual faculty or nurse administrator interview. This will be an interview for the same position that you submitted content for in Assignment 2, in week 3. We will use your cover letter and your CV as the basis for your materials to prepare for the interview. Come prepared as if for an actual interview!
- Reflection: following the interview, you are asked to compose a 1-2-page
 reflection that examines your perceived strengths and areas for improvement,
 with your own reflection and suggestions on how to address areas for
 improvement.
